PRE/POST TOURS

PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY (TO LOS ANGELES)

Santa Barbara to Peterson Automotive Museum via Hwy 1/101

(Santa Barbara to Peterson Automotive Museum: 2-3 hours, 94 miles)

Times do not include stopping time for attractions, lunch. Drive time can vary considerably depending on traffic.

This is the last official section of the PCH Hwy 1 drive, but worth the effort. The suggested route stops for lunch in **Malibu** and then ends at the unforgettable **Peterson Automotive Museum**. After that, you are on your own to explore Los Angeles, Orange County and San Diego.

DIRECTIONS TO MALIBU: (1 ½ hours, 67 miles)

- Make your way to Hwy 101 South.
- In 36.3 miles, take exit 60 for Rice Avenue. Green sign "EXIT 60, RICE AVE, →".
- At the end of the off ramp, turn right onto Hwy 1.
- In 3.9 miles, fork left onto Hwy 1 – direction Santa Monica. Green sign "1 SOUTH, Santa Monica".
- In 29.4 miles, at stoplight, turn right onto Paradise Cove Road. Big white sign "Paradise Cove Beach Café". **Stop for lunch.**

Open daily from 8am.

DIRECTIONS FROM MALIBU TO THE PETERSON AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM: (1 hour, 28 miles)

- Back up to Hwy 1 and turn right (south).
- In 18.1 miles, Hwy 1 becomes I-10 East. **DO NOT TAKE EXIT 1A, LINCOLN BLVD.**
- In 7.1 miles, take exit 7B, Fairfax Avenue. Green sign “Fairfax Ave →”.
- In 0.4 miles, at the end of the ramp, turn left onto Fairfax Avenue. Blue street sign “Fairfax Av”.
- In 1.9 miles, arrive at the Peterson on the right, enter the parking structure.

Museum + Vault Access \$51/\$45 (allow an extra 90 minutes for the Vault)

(Note: The Vault is a large underground area where 300 non-museum cars are displayed.

Many rare and iconic cars including Hollywood star cars.)

Parking \$18 for two hours, \$3 per hour thereafter, max \$24. **Free with Museum Store purchase.** The Museum Café is open until 3pm Sunday – Thursday and 4pm weekends.

Fancy an after-tour cocktail or snack? One block south on Fairfax is **Tom Bergin's Irish Pub**, the oldest licensed bar in Los Angeles. While there is limited parking at the Pub, you can leave your car parked at the Museum and walk.

Southern California lodgings can be expensive, particularly in the most well-known and beach-oriented communities like Santa Monica, Newport Beach and La Jolla. More budget-friendly options include:

- In the LA area, stay off the beach or in the less popular areas like Redondo Beach and Hermosa Beach. Avoid the airport area and downtown.
- In Orange County, try Dana Point and San Clemente.
- In San Diego, look at Oceanside, Carlsbad and Encinitas.

Do visit:

- Long Beach and the Queen Mary. (LA)
- Drive Hwy 1 from Long Beach to Dana Point for coastal views. (OC)
- Laguna Beach is a great town to stroll as is San Clemente. (OC)
- In San Diego visit La Jolla and Del Mar, as well as Coronado Island. (SD)
- Don't miss two of San Diego's best culinary neighborhoods, Little Italy and the Gaslamp.
- If you are a baseball fan, each area has a major league club: Dodgers in LA, Angels in OC and Padres in SD. One of them is bound to be at home during your visit. Petco Park, where the Padres play, is particularly interesting and fan friendly.
- If you are interested in dropping by a local Cars & Coffee, go to socalciculture.com/events which list many of the meet ups and car shows throughout Southern California.
