

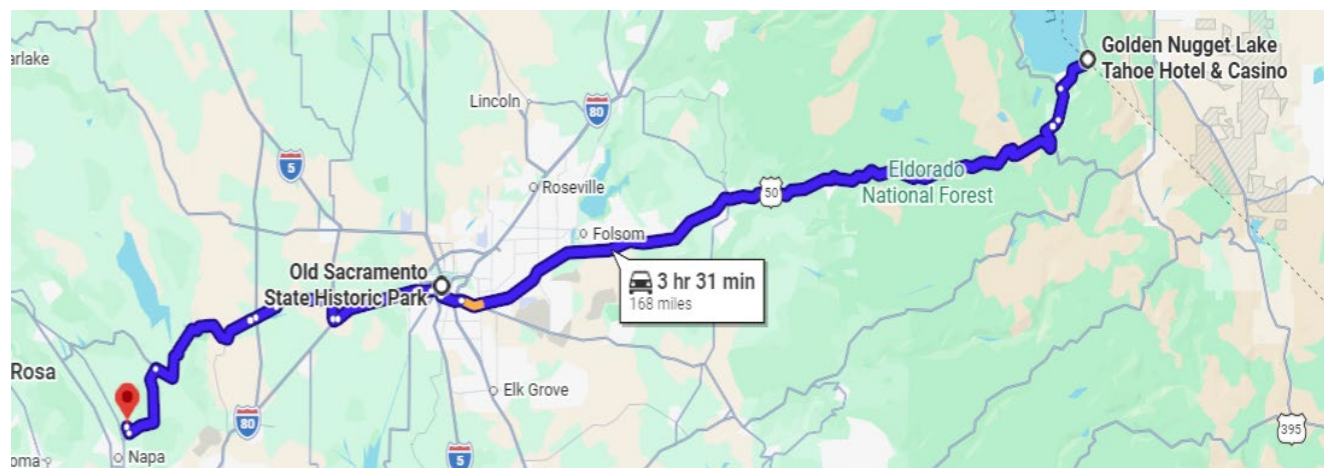


HEALEY 75th ANNIVERSARY MEET

PRE/POST TOURS

THE NAPA VALLEY

For wine lovers, there is nothing like the **Napa Valley**. An easy three-and-a-half-hour drive from Tahoe, mostly on scenic Hwys 50, 121 and 128, this route features a stopover at historic **Old Sacramento State Historic Park**, a perfect spot for lunch.



DRIVING DIRECTIONS (2 hours to Old Sacramento)

- Turn right out of the hotel onto Hwy 50 West
- In 5.1 miles, turn left to stay on Hwy 50 (green sign for Sacramento)
 - Continue 99 miles to Sacramento
- Stay in the center lane and take the exit for 99/5 South (green sign “North 5 99 Redding”)
 - In 1.0 miles, take Exit 519B for J Street and Downtown (green sign)
 - In 0.2 miles, Turn left onto 3rd Street at the stoplight.
 - In 500 feet, at T, turn left onto I Street
- In 500 feet, turn left onto 2nd Street. **Most of the historic buildings, shops and restaurants are on 2nd and there is on-street parking. Stop, Shop and Eat.**

CONTINUING ON TO NAPA (1.5 hours to Silverado Resort, recommended hotel)

- Continue on 2nd Street to the stoplight, then Right onto Capital Mall (green sign “Capital”
 - In 1.4 miles, merge onto Hwy 50 West
 - In 2.1 miles, Hwy 50 becomes I-80 (San Francisco)
- In 10.8 miles (in Davis), take Exit 70 for Hwy 113 (green sign “113 North, Exit 70, Woodland”)
- In 2.9 miles, take exit 29 for Covell Blvd (green sign “Exit 29, Road 31, Covell Blvd”)
 - In 0.2 miles at stoplight, Left onto Covell Blvd.
 - In 11.0 miles, in Winters, road becomes Hwy 128, continue
 - In 20.9 miles, Fork left onto Hwy 121 (Green sign “Napa”, green sign “121 ←”)
- In 11.1 miles, at stoplight, Right onto Atlas Peak Road (green sign “Atlas Peak Rd”)
 - In 0.8 miles, right onto Club House Drive (blue signs for “Silverado Resort”)

IF YOU ARE STAYING ELSEWHERE, CONTINUE ON HWY 121 INTO DOWNTOWN NAPA

NAPA RESOURCES

- **Napa Valley Visitors Guide** is a comprehensive listing of hotels, restaurants, wineries and other attractions. <https://www.visitnapavalley.com/maps-travel-info/visitors-guide/>
- **Don't Miss Drive:** Take the Silverado Trail north to Calistoga (mud baths) then cross over to Hwy 128 and Hwy 29 South, back to Napa. You'll pass all the famous vineyards.
- **If you have time, visit Sonoma Valley:** “Next Door” to Napa Valley to the West and running parallel to the Napa Valley is Sonoma Valley, another great wine growing region. Take Hwy 12 to Santa Rosa, then Hwy 101 South towards San Francisco.

NEXT STOP/TOUR: PACIFIC COAST HWY CENTRAL SECTION (PART 1)

- This tour links up perfectly with a visit to **San Francisco** and then perhaps a run down the famous **Pacific Coast Highway**.
- If you are staying a couple of nights in the SF area, consider a hotel in **Sausalito**, a laid-back community just north of SF beyond the Golden Gate Bridge. Besides touring Sausalito, you can take a **ferry to Fisherman's Wharf** (Pier 39) in San

Francisco and make a day trip without the hassle of driving and parking in the City. After a crab lunch at the Wharf, visit nearby **Hyde Street Pier, The Cannery and Ghirardelli Square**, then grab the **Cable Car** (blue line Powell-Mason) at the corner of Hyde and Beach. Ride the car all the way to **Union Square** with a possible stop off in **Chinatown**. Retrace your route to Pier 39 and return to Sausalito.
